REMINDER ABOUT POLICE CHECKS

Our Board of Directors has implemented a new policy that each volunteer needs to provide a Vulnerable Sector Check that has been completed in the last 12 months. I will provide you with a letter to take to the RCMP in town to obtain the check. There will be a \$5 fee. Once complete, you will be able to upload the form to the Better Impact website or you can email it and I'll upload it for you. The goal is to have these completed by December.

SAFETY REMINDERS

With so many new volunteers starting, I wanted to make sure everyone is more aware than ever about safety. Here's my top 3 reminders: 1) don't lift any items above your head 2) only use ladders to reach higher places 3) no earphones in the warehouse. THANK YOU!

SORTING REMINDERS – QUALITY OVER QUANTITY

Another friendly reminder to please focus on QUALITY over QUANTITY when sorting. We don't want to make any clients sick by missing items past their "still tasty" dates or especially an EXPIRY DATE – in the case of baby food or protein drinks like Ensure. Slow down and have a fellow volunteer double check something you're not sure of. Also, it's so helpful if items are placed neatly in the crates as we often have to stack the crates on top of each other to move them to a different shelf or area in the warehouse. Please do not stack <u>ANY</u> items above the lip of the crate. The first photo is what <u>NOT</u> to do and the second photo is a <u>GOOD</u> example.
